

APPLICATION OF SANUM REMEDIES IN VAPORIZED FORM VIA NEBULIZERS AS GOOD AS IV INJECTIONS

Subject to receiving government certification (through taking a training course) naturopaths in Ontario are authorized to administer injectibles. The experience to date has been that these courses have only been offered infrequently and they are typically overbooked requiring one to place his/her name on a waiting list for a future course. Yet, at least in the case of Sanum remedies, there is a more patient-friendly and convenient procedure available that is producing positive results which some rate as effective as IV injections. This approach is called "nebulization". Since most children and many adults are horrified of needles, the application of Sanum remedies by means of a nebulizer warrants serious consideration.

What is a Nebulizer? A nebulizer is a fairly simple device that uses pressurized air to turn a liquid medication into a fine mist for inhalation. The pressurized air typically comes from a portable pump unit that internally consists of a motor-driven air pump that resembles the fancier types of aquarium pumps. It forces air through a plastic tube into the plastic nebulizer unit. Inside, the nebulizer unit acts much like a perfume atomizer, creating a fine mist that is directed either through a tube that you inhale through or a mask that directs the mist into your nose and mouth.

A nebulizer can be used either in a clinic setting (doctor's office) or (with instruction) a patient may perform the nebulizing process at home. Either way it is a simple and effective means of applying Sanum remedies.

Nebulizers - Can be as Good as IV Injections The systemic uptake of vaporized medication in the lungs has been well demonstrated in various clinical trials. It guarantees great efficacy, which comes close to an IV injection. Dr. Sandy Woods, ND (Richmond Hill, ON) and Dr. Kirk Slagel, ND (Phoenix, AZ), two doctors with extensive experience using Sanum remedies, both claim from personal experience that using a nebulizers for the application of Sanum remedies can be as effective or more effective than IV injections.

In Allopathic medicine, nebulizers are commonly used as the method of application for patients with asthma and chronic obstructive airways disease. Also in acutely ill patients, where a quick IV access cannot be established, it is the preferred form of application over IM or SC injections because the uptake is quicker and more effective.

Nebulizers and Sanum Remedies Sanum portable sips (ampoules) contain the active ingredient in sodium chloride. This means they are unlikely to cause lung irritation making them ideally suited for application by nebulizer. Research from Germany supports portable sips (ampoules) from the milieu modulation, fungal and botanical categories as the types of Sanum remedies that are suitable for nebulizing.

The Choice of Nebulizer There are many different makes of nebulizers for clinic and home use on the market. Most medical supply houses carry a range of nebulizers. A number of practitioners throughout North America (and beyond) are already having great success with their patients using this method of application. In some cases, patients have bought their own nebulizer for home use because they feel that this kind of application is superior to oral intake and/or it saves on the time of having to travel to the doctor's office. Other patients phone in to specifically make an appointment to "have the nebulizer" because they feel "a cold coming on" or a bit "chesty" or "sinusy". In other cases, we have heard of clinics in the US that rent nebulizers out to patients for "home use" for the duration of their treatment.

Summary A nebulizer represents an alternative easy to use, patient-friendly way to administer Sanum milieu modulation, fungal and botanical remedies that practitioner use indicates can be as effective as an IV injection.
